1. Czermanski, Zdzislaw (1900–1970)

Soldier of the Pilsudski Legion. Studied art under Z. Sichulski in Lwow and Fernand Leger in Paris. Known as a caricaturist of Marshal Pilsudski and an illustrator for major magazines in London and the United States. Since 1941 he lived in New York City. His works were exhibited in individual and group shows in Europe and the United States. Close friend of Jan Lechon, Kazimierz Wierzynski and Jozef Wittlin. He was a leading figure of Polish boheme in New York. He left a great body of artistic work tightly connected with Polish history, culture and folklore.

4. Pitynski, Andrzej (1947–)

Born in Ulanow, Poland. He studied sculpture at the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow at the studio of Professor Jerzy Bandura. He graduated in 1974, receiving Master of Fine Arts Degree in Sculpture. That same year he started work at G.Z.U.T. foundry in Gliwice, Poland, specializing in casting colossal monuments in bronze. After arriving in New York, he began to study at the Art Students League. His works like “Katyn 1940”, “Siberia 1939”, “Avenger” and many others are created in connection with Polish history and its unique spirit. Artist is a member of the prestigious American National Sculpture Society as well as Allalde Artists of America, American Medalic Sculpture Society and Audubon Artists. He won many awards and his works can be found in museums, private collections, churches and public spaces in Europe and the United States.


5. Rysztof, Teresa (–)

Studied painting at Academy of Art in Poznan, Poland, under supervision of Norbert Skupniewicz who greatly influenced her artistic creativity. Since 1994 she lives and works in the United States. She uses her own technique to express herself on paper using distempers. She presented her artwork in many individual and group art shows in Poland, France, Germany and the United States. 8. Nikifor (1895–1968)

Lived his entire life in the vicinity of Krynica, Poland. He was a descendant of an Ukrainian tribe. His mother was a washerwoman and he did not know his father. He began to paint very early in life. Deeply and naively religious, he formed his concept of God, Heaven and Hell from the paintings seen in the Orthodox and Catholic churches. Illiterate, he tried to conceal the fact as well as increase the importance of his paintings by drawing in certain expressions, usually spelled incorrectly. Convinced that he would find in the other world the justice that eluded him in this one, he frequently portrayed himself as a Bishop-Wise Man, a Bishop-Judge, as a musician and as a painter. His works are in many museums and private collections in Poland and abroad. His works have been on display in many international exhibitions.


12. Kwapiszewska, Danuta (1908–1999)

She also painted and sculpted dance and ballet subjects which were very close to her heart since she herself was a dancer. She studied art at the Academy of Fine Arts in Warsaw where she lived until her death. Her work received significant recognition among collectors for its class and elegance.

She lives and works in New York. Independent artist and art connoisseur. Her deep, life-long interest and passion for art and poetry led her to find painting as the best way of expressing herself. She considers her work to be painted poetry celebrating the joy of life. She began to paint after being inspired by Isabella Stibal (student of Jacek Malczewski) and by the personality and work of Włodzimierz Puchalski. Studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow under supervision of J. Mehoffer, L. Wyczolkowski, J. Pankiewicz and J. Stanislawski who had the greatest influence on the artist. He served in the Polish Legions (1914–1917). From 1937 he was a professor at the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow. He is considered a great landscapist and the most talented student of professor J. Stanislawski. He also painted decorative still lifes.


